Primary Objective

To play a key role by delivering services for the Youth Theatre programme (QYouth) in order to maintain the current level of success and contribute to the programmes development.

Person Specification

Candidates for this role will:

- have a passion for youth theatre work, demonstrating a track record with youth theatre or participatory arts projects
- have experience of directing or devising youth theatre productions
- have a strong interest in ensemble work, and an ability to work with participants of differing ages, interests and needs
- be able to respond imaginatively to the room, switching easily between play-based activities, devised and scripted formats
- be a reliable and organised professional

Main Duties

To support the facilitation of regular Youth Theatre sessions and productions:

- to plan and deliver fun, exciting and inspirational sessions relevant to the group's focus area, age and ability
- share responsibility for weekly planning and monitoring as well as communicating effectively with the Youth Theatre Director to clarify the aims and content of sessions
- to attend tutor and production meetings as required
- to be available all day on performance dates to lead the group and support the production
- To be aware of, and to adhere to and uphold, the Theatre's policy on Protection of Children and Young People
- The service provider will be subject to a Disclosures and Barring Service check
- The service provider will be asked to apply for a Chaperone Licence (cost covered by the Theatre) and to fulfil duties as a Chaperone on relevant Youth Theatre productions
