

Having Changing: what's it all about

Having Changing is an exciting new programme shaped by local people, that will run for 4 years from 2020 – 2023.

We want to get your responses to the following initial ideas:

'On Your Doorstep'

- Local people will be supported to go and see a range of activities across London and beyond that they might then decide to put on in their area, indoors and outdoors, in spaces of their choice
- Local artists, and those further afield, will be able to apply for money to deliver projects responding to the interests of Havering communities – residents will decide which are the best ideas to get funded
- Local people will work together on a bigger project each year exploring and celebrating the place in which they live

Fresh new **free creative activities** to see, do and get involved in – in **Harold Hill, Romford Town Centre, Rainham and Orchard Village.**



'In the Know'

- Local people will be trained to encourage other residents to get involved in existing projects, helping with anything that currently stops people from doing so

'Communities Celebrating'

- New free festivals for everyone, bringing a range of people together to celebrate their heritage and that of Havering


Having Changing is a new consortium of eight organisations, led by Queen's Theatre Hornchurch, working with Clarion Futures (the charitable foundation of Clarion Housing Group), Havering Colleges, Havering Interfaith Forum, Havering Volunteer Centre, Havering Youth Services and myplace. Rainham Association for Village Events (R.A.V.E.), and The Mercury Shopping Centre.

Having Changing will trial radical new ideas that engage local people in arts and culture in a variety of new ways, focusing on communities in Harold Hill, Romford, Rainham and Orchard Village. The consortium will collaborate closely to support local decision makers, learning and evaluating as the project develops.

Having Changing will deliver this £1,350,000 programme over the next four years, principally funded through Arts Council England's Creative People and Places Fund which focuses investment in parts of the country where people's involvement in arts and culture is in the bottom third of engagement according to the Active Lives Survey.
